2. CONCESSIONAL FINANCE TO PwDs (DIVYNAGJAN)

• Sanction of Loan

During the month of March, 2022, the Corporation sanctioned loan amounting to Rs. 1846.90 Lakhs for the benefit of 1811 Persons with Disabilities (PwDs).

• Release of Loan

During the month of March, 2022, the Corporation released loan amounting to;

a) Rs. 18.53 Cr. for the benefit of 1811 PwDs under Divyangjan Swavalamban Yojana (DSY) .

b) Rs. 10.00 Crore for the benefit of PwDs under Vishesh Micro Finance Yojana (VMY).

• Loan Size

As at the end of March, 2022, book size of loans extended for the benefit of Divyangjan was Rs. 395.00 Crores.

• Repayments received

During the month under reference, the Corporation received Rs.12.08 Crores (Rs.11.61 Crores as Principal and Rs.0.47 Crores as interest) as repayments.

a) 2nd March, 2022

f) 30th & 31st March, 2022

A Meeting was held between officials of the Corporation and those of Kerala State Handicapped Persons Welfare Development Corporation regarding implementation of schemes of the Corporation in Kerala. Among other things, issues concerning reconciliation of utilization details were discussed at the meeting.

4. AWARENESS CREATION ACTIVITIES / JOB FAIR ETC.

- a) During the month under report, the Corporation published its schemes on Social Media/ online mode.

b) 4th & 5th March, 2022

NHFDC organized 2 (Two) days sensitization workshop at Kevadia, Gujarat. Officials of the Corporation disseminated the information concerning NHFDC Schemes for the benefit of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs).

c) 10th March, 2022

NHFDC participated in the Job Fair organized by Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for Handicapped at Karkardoma, New Delhi and disseminated the information concerning NHFDC Schemes for the benefit of PwDs.

d) 10th – 11th March, 2022

- i) NHFDC participated in the awareness Camp organized by Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Delhi at GTB Hospital, Dilshad Garden, New Delhi and disseminated the information concerning the Schemes of the Corporation for the benefit of PwDs.

- ii) Preventive Health Check-up was conducted for all employees of the Corporation from 21st to 25th March, 2022 at Batra Hospital & Medical Research Centre, New Delhi.
- iii) The Corporation formed a Committee on Sexual Harassment of Women at work place.

b) ACTION TAKEN IN RESPONSE TO COVID-2019

During the month under reference, following measures were continued/acted upon, to fight against COVID-2019;

- i) All employees were advised to clean hand and face frequently.
- ii) Every employee is being advised to wear Mask, use Sanitizer on regular basis and have been advised to maintain Social distance.
- iii) Reception area/ Entrance to the office were frequently cleaned and sanitized.
- iv) Foot operated hand sanitizer machine was continued to be placed at the reception area.
- v) Wall mounted Thermal scanner (Touch-free) was continued to be placed at the reception area to measure the body temperature of employees/ visitors coming to the office.
- vi) All office vehicles were sanitized two/three times, on daily basis.
- vii) Office premises/work places (including Table/Desk), doors and door-handles were sanitized with Sodium Hypochlorite on daily basis.
